Each committee member – all volunteers – have different and complementary skill sets that were on full display in 2021. "We are absolutely all superstars, but no one person can do everything," says Katie Schaffer, a founding member of the commission. "Together, we are unstoppable."

Jean Deighan has a strong business background and adds a wonderful perspective to many of the commission's decisions. Kathy Lena has started work on a proposal to create a social media presence for the commission on Facebook and Instagram. Jeff Wahlstrom is facilitating long-term planning, which will help the commission look into the future. Brad Coffey finds donors who are excited to support the healing arts. Katie and Deb Dall, another founding member of the commission, continue to set up each show and dream big while researching what other hospitals are doing to incorporate the arts into their spaces.

"There is a clamor for more art, with hospital departments asking, 'When is it our turn?' We're starting to develop a plan to scale our efforts and try new things," notes Katie excitedly.

A SURVIVOR'S STORY

The Protection of a SAFE Place – the Compassion of a SAFE Nurse

I was lucky ... my best friend is an advocate by profession. We walked hand in hand into St. Joseph's Hospital, and she asked for a SAFE nurse – something I never knew existed. I knew my privacy would be respected, just by the immediate care and compassion I received at reception. We waited very briefly for a nurse named Keri. She had kind eyes, and I will never forget her.

Keri was so gentle and respectful of my fragility. She explained how things would go, what examinations she would need to perform and that I would always have the ability to say that's enough, no more. As Keri began taking an inventory from my memory of the assault, one thing stood out to me. When I said he threw me to the ground and choked me, she stopped me and said, "Let's call this what it is — domestic violence strangulation." Oddly, putting an official name to what happened to me was comforting. Knowing I was not the only one and "it" had a real name, felony.

for the previous 24 hours. After all of the appropriate photos had been taken and statements had been made, Keri asked for a CT scan of my throat, due to my constant throat clearing. She explained in great detail that residual swelling was a danger after strangulation and she felt it was important for me to have that scan.

I felt so cared for and protected.

Having this safe place to go — to be taken care of and given my voice back is something I will always remember. **I would not be here today without the care and concern I received at St. Joseph's Hospital and its very special SAFE nurse, Keri.** She was one of the pieces of a big puzzle that kept me whole during the very darkest time of my life.

The SAFE team performed **186 medical forensic encounters and other consults** for survivors of interpersonal violence and at-risk populations.

The SAFE team served **593 community members** through education and training on various topics around interpersonal violence.

“My story is not unlike countless others’. *I was physically attacked by a man I believed would never harm me. I was genuinely in fear for my life.*”

I told my entire story to this stranger I knew would go to bat for me that night. She said, “You are now 1,000 times more likely to die by his hands. Listen to me carefully. Your life is at risk. I am so glad you are here.”

I will never forget that moment.

I recall watching myself in the reflection of the doors as Keri gently and compassionately measured, noted and photographed each bruise, scratch, blister and mark on my body.

While I wanted to retreat into myself, she was engaging and friendly. She told me everything I needed to know as a survivor. This allowed me to remain present and not dissociate as I had



Commit to Get Fit Makes Strides in Supporting the SAFE Program

The Sexual Assault Forensic Nurse Examiner (SAFE) program at St. Joe's is invaluable to the residents of Maine. Thanks to the compassionate staff, donors and participants of *Commit to Get Fit* and community support from our partners, the SAFE program has expanded services and is reaching and supporting more vulnerable people than ever before.

The SAFE program provides professional nursing care for survivors of sexual assault and domestic violence, elder abuse, child abuse, human trafficking and self-inflicted strangulation. As the scope of the work grew, so did the number of Mainers served each year — rising from 64 individuals in 2017 to 186 in 2021. We currently serve over half of Maine's counties.

The continuing support from the annual *Commit to Get Fit* event has helped the SAFE program grow. Keri Kapaldo, RN, was appointed to the new position of SAFE clinical leader in April 2021. She oversees three SAFE nurses and two additional nurses who are receiving SAFE training thanks to *Commit to Get Fit* support. A certified Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner for adults who also holds that credential in the state of Maine, Keri has been a key member of St. Joe's SAFE team since 2014. In her new role, Keri is answering the community's call for more education and outreach programming. She regularly trains emergency responders, university students, hospital personnel, shelter staff and others on how to recognize the signs of human trafficking, care for survivors of domestic abuse and sexual assault, and how to refer survivors to St. Joe's SAFE program.

The impact that the *Commit to Get Fit* event has had on strengthening this important and necessary program cannot be overstated. Thank you for your support of *Commit to Get Fit* in 2021! Whether you walked, ran, volunteered or donated, you made a difference. Our goal in 2022 is to hire more SAFE nurses and ensure the program will be available to our community 24/7. 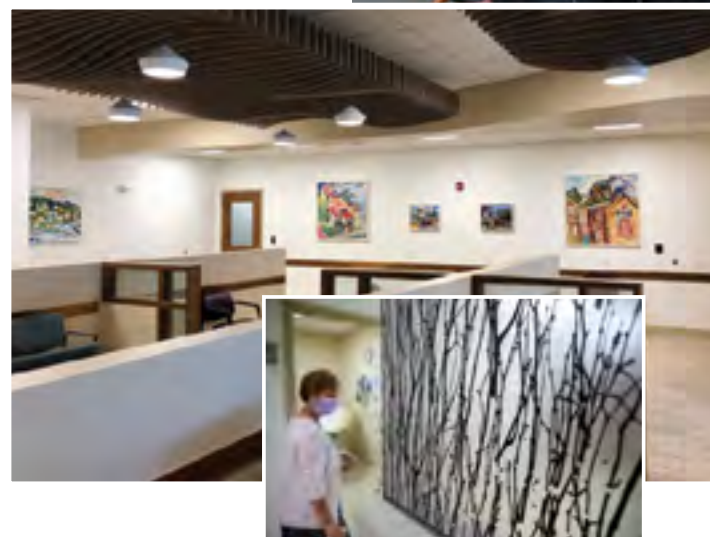
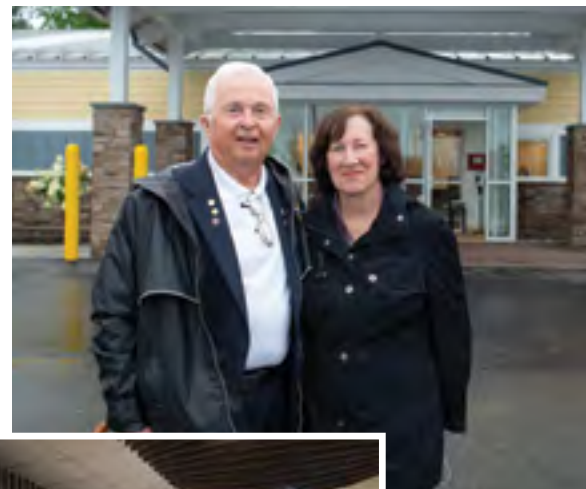
Opening of the Darling Building

Helping with Basic Needs Supports a Healthier Community

It has been a difficult year, and many people have struggled to pay rent and feed their families. Others have faced unexpected financial difficulties when a car broke down or an injury kept them out of work.

At St. Joe's, we understand that financial emergencies often force people to put their health needs aside. That's one of the reasons the Mother Mary Angela Fund provides healing and care for the whole person.

Named after Blessed Mary Angela, founder of the Felician Sisters which first established St. Joseph Hospital, this fund was created to support our employees and neighbors in need. Relying solely on philanthropic gifts, the fund helps the hospital's employees and patients with expenses such as prescription copays, travel, minor medical equipment and more.

When a St. Joe's employee was temporarily out of work due to severe depression, her bills and missed rent payments quickly piled up. Thanks to donations to the Mother Mary Angela Fund, we were able to provide a full month's rent to ease the burden and keep this mother and her three children safely housed.

A St. Joe's patient who was visiting a friend in Maine came into our Emergency Department with mental and physical health concerns. Her friend asked that the patient not come back to her home, but the patient had no way to return to her family in Illinois. The Emergency Department staff went the extra mile to refer the patient to the Mother Mary Angela Fund, which helped arrange for her flight home to Illinois.

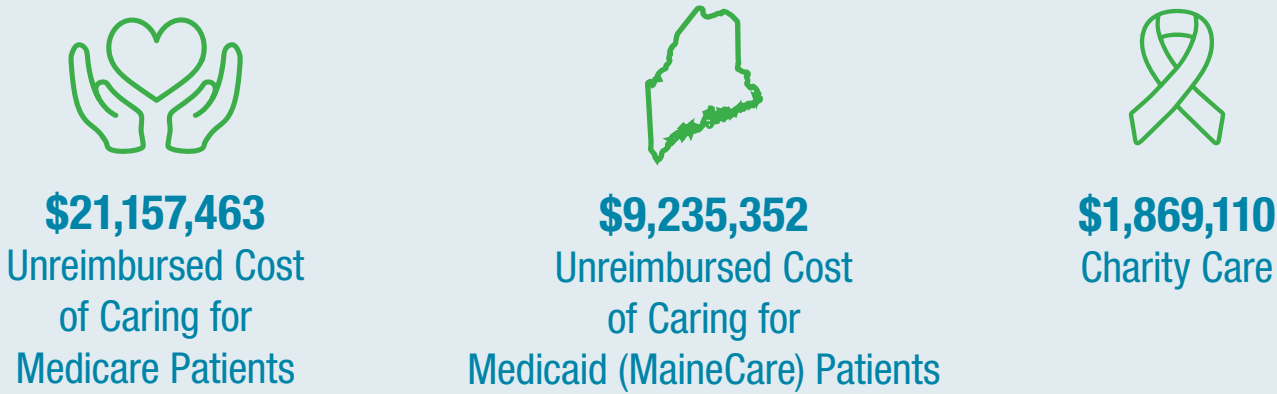

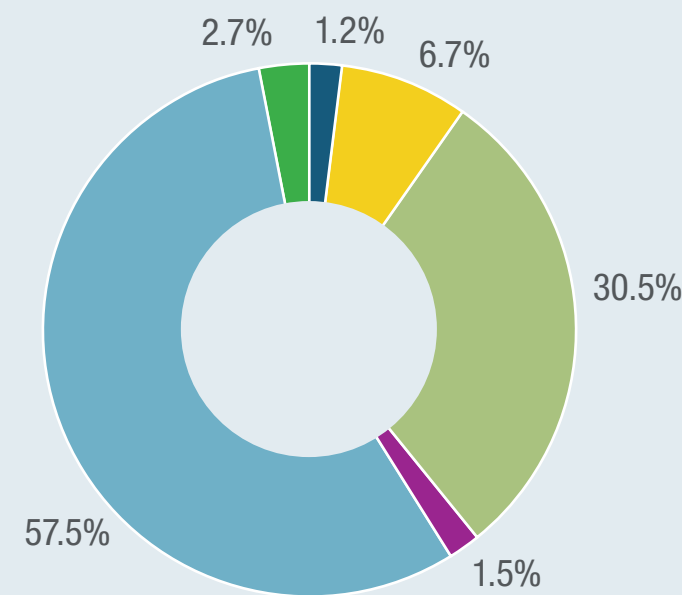

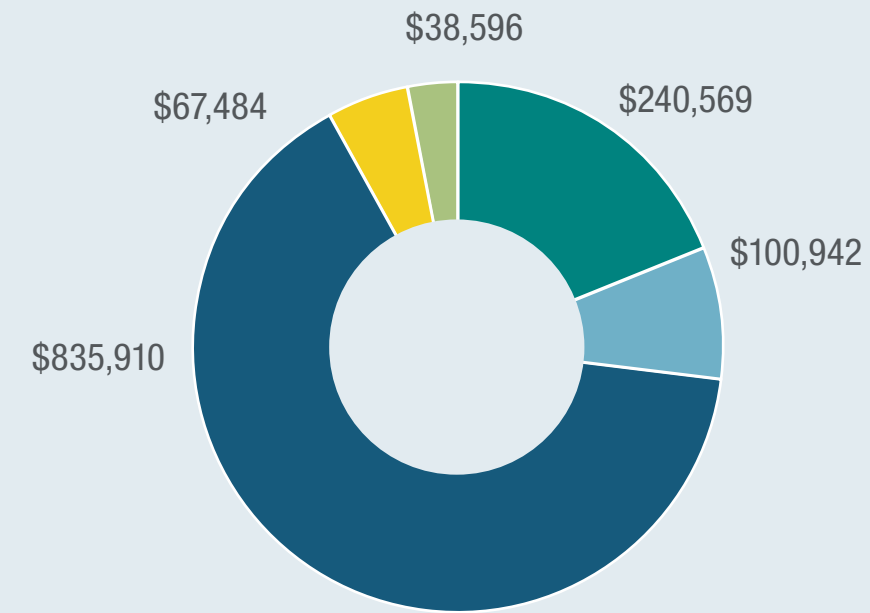
