

Thank you to the Gero family for their gift and many years of devoted service to St. Joseph Healthcare's mission of providing healing and care for the whole person, in service to all.




The Peter and Carmen Lucia Buck Foundation Transforms Rural Healthcare with Grant Funding

In rural America, many struggle to find quality healthcare. But thanks to a \$150,000 grant over 18 months from the Peter and Carmen Lucia Buck Foundation, that's changing.

With this funding, we're pioneering shared workforce programs that bridge the gap between emergency medical services (EMS) and rural clinics. Imagine EMS providers seamlessly transitioning from medical assistants in clinics during regular office hours to heroes responding to 911 calls. This uninterrupted care for those in need will help solve rural clinic and EMS workforce shortages.

Over the next year, we'll partner with Eastern Maine Community College and other clinical organizations to hire and train medical assistants; identify communities in need of support; and develop, implement and evaluate the program's impact. The program will involve a mix of Community Care Partnership of Maine (CCPM) and non-CCPM federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) and rural clinics.



Everyone deserves access to local, timely primary care and emergency services, regardless of race, class or location. With help from our strategic partners and donors like the Peter and Carmen Lucia Buck Foundation, we're not just changing lives — we're transforming communities and improving rural healthcare for years to come.



The Bingham Program Supports Recovery with Sober Housing Grant

With heartfelt appreciation for the \$4,560 grant from the esteemed Bingham Program, St. Joseph Healthcare will address a critical need in our communities: sober housing for individuals facing homelessness and substance use disorder (SUD) who need outpatient intravenous antibiotics treatment.

This pilot program, born of necessity and fueled by compassion, offers sanctuary to 20 vulnerable individuals. St. Joe's is the first hospital in the state with level III Pain and Addiction Care in the Emergency Department Accreditation (PACED) by the American College of Emergency Physicians. We are uniquely equipped to address SUDs with earlier treatment than if patients were confined to the hospital for the full six weeks of required therapy, which many patients do not complete.

It's not just about providing access to medical care; it's about creating safe, stable environments conducive to healing. Thanks to the support of donors like the Bingham Program, we're breaking down barriers for recovery and sustained wellness. Together, we're making tangible strides in the lives of those who need it most.

Pulmonary Function Tests Cut Wait Times and Improve Lung Health

We recently acquired two new donor-funded pulmonary function test (PFT) units. These tests measure lung volume, capacity, rates of flow and gas exchange to diagnose and treat lung disorders. Previously, patients had a six-month wait for these tests. With the new units, we've reduced the wait time to under two months, alleviating stress and improving patient satisfaction.

"We are incredibly thankful for our donors' support," says Nathaniel Rockwell, MHA, senior operations manager of medical imaging and diagnostic services. "Our previous equipment was over 12 years old, and having new, reliable equipment has significantly increased employee morale. At the end of the day, we want the best for our patients, and this equipment ensures they receive the best tests."



Cutting-Edge Microscope Enhances Surgical Precision

Our donors also helped us acquire the Leica microscope, the gold standard for neurosurgery and minimally invasive spine surgery. This advanced tool magnifies nerves and blood vessels in 3D. It enables minimal tissue disruption during surgeries, improves patient outcomes and reduces recovery times. Its precision and clarity have revolutionized our surgical procedures.

Robotic Sterilization Instrument Improves Patient Safety

The STERIS InnoWave[™] Pro washer/disinfector has transformed our reprocessing of robotic instrumentation. It uses ultrasonic technology to maximize productivity and disinfect thoroughly. This donor-funded equipment has streamlined our sterilization processes, improved operational efficiency and reduced patient infection risks.
